

FRANCISCO BEJA CAFÉ-CONCERT



ETHICAL CODE POLYTHECNIC INSTITUT OF PORTO (EXTRACT)

GENERAL ETHICAL PRINCIPLES

The Polytechnic of Porto through its actions must promote values and general ethical principles: From these we emphasize the following:

- Personal freedom and independence;
- Individual and collective diversity that stimulates the participation and constructive critic;
- Honesty and academic rigor in activities of pedagogical and administrative nature;
- Equal opportunities;
- Respect for human dignity;
- Individual and collective responsibility;
- Social and citizenship responsibility;
- Promotion to an internal environment that favours the personal development of all members of the academic community.

GENERAL DUTIES TO THE MEMBERS OF THE ACADEMIC COMMUNITY

Firstly, the members of the academic community are obliged to the duties imposed by law, statutes and regulation for the proceeding activities applied by the Institute and organic unities. Secondly, they have as general duties, among others, the following:

- Provide aid and assistance to the remaining members of the academic community.

The students have as their individual duties, among others, the following:

- Be punctual and assiduous:
- Refrain of any action or incident that by nature may disturb the classes or other academic activities;

- Refrain committing illicit academic action that evidence fraudulent behaviour;
- Keep inform of all subjects considered necessary and of interest for the students' performance, namely the academic and disciplinary regulations;
- Fulfil the objectives, working methodologies and evaluation procedures of knowledge;
- Do not use improperly any computerised resource that are provided;
- To return every material or equipment held in custody on time and in condition;
- To participate actively the filling of the inquiries related to the perceptions of the learning/teaching process;
- Exhibit the identification card of Polytechnic of Porto or other valid identification documents, whenever it is legally solicited.

PROFESSORS AND RESEARCHERS' DUTIES

Firstly, the professors and researchers are obliged to the duties imposed by law, namely the Professors' Career Statutes, the statutes and regulations into force.

Secondly, as individual duties, among others, the following:

- Execute their functions exclusively to the public's interest;
- Assure an ethical base in every teaching, research activity or extension;
- To apply their dictated functions by the values of honesty, competence, availability and neutrality;
- Be punctual and assiduous;
- To guarantee the update and quality of the pedagogical and instrumental contents;
- Assure with punctuality and accessibility the supporting activities to the students;
- Provide to the students relevant information for their academic success, either within the classroom, or though other methods or instruments;
- Contribute to a prosperous environment in the classroom enabling to the normal development of the learning process;
- Adopt evaluative methodologies to assess the merit;
- Use evaluation instruments, whose degree of difficulty is not higher than those used as standard during the academic year;
- Respect the good practices of the learning/teaching, by recognising with rigor the sources and pedagogical material used in academic activities, promoting its updating and adaption to the current pedagogical context;
- Respect and enforce the good practices of scientific research and the principles of honesty and academic rigor, either in investigations conducted by themselves, or in academic work guidelines;
- To mentor adequately the students' research papers, mainly from the 2nd year of Masters' Degree, as well from other professors or researchers that develop projects under their counselling or supervision;
- Guarantee the development of the teaching, research and extended activities, according to the norms and protocols of safety for people and goods;
- Assure, on the established deadlines, the registration of all relevant information of the students' performance, as well various elements of evaluation;
- Manage with transparency and restrain the financial means in the field of teaching, research and extended projects, and assure its conclusion on the established deadlines;
- Refuse any unwanted offer or take positions or functions related to the main providers of goods and services of IPP;
- Assure the professional secrecy of all facts and elements acknowledge.
